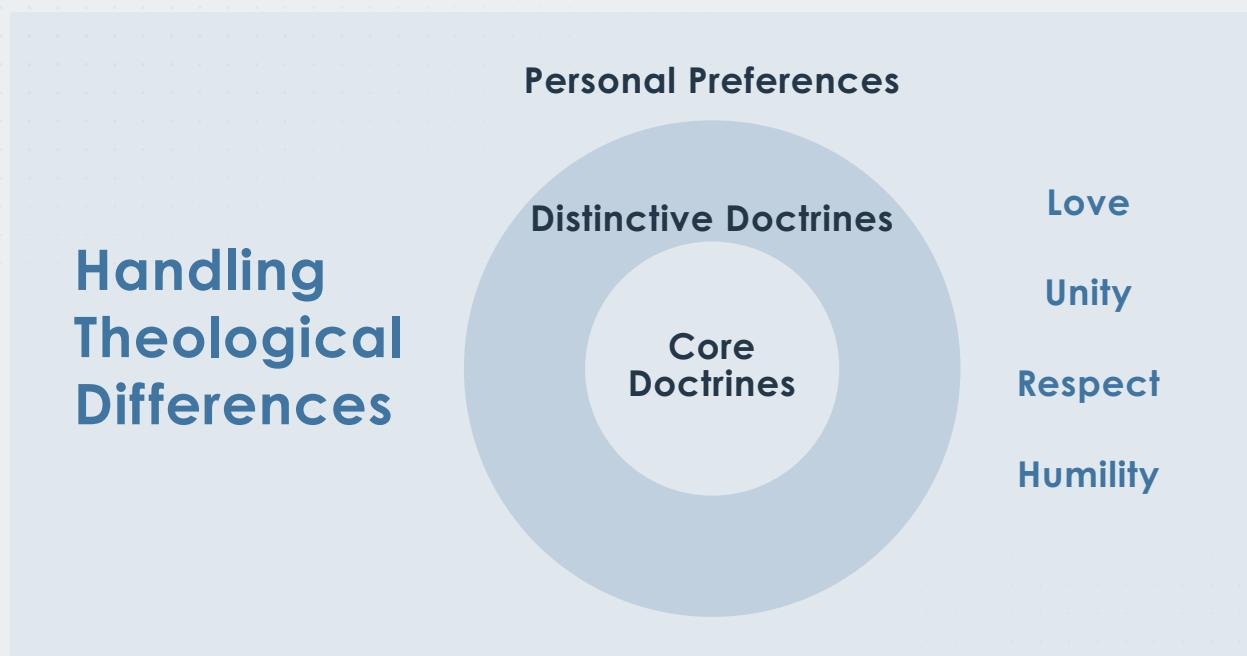


# WONDERING ABOUT SIGNS AND WONDERS

The Question of Signs and Wonders

How should we manage the conversation when we disagree with other believers?



Allowing the Bible to direct us to the right questions to find answers

Is there are linkage between the signs and wonders, gifts, and the ministry of the apostles?  
(Mark 16:17; Acts 2:43, 4:33, 5:12, 14:3; Romans 15:19; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Hebrews 2:3-4)

What are the biblical qualifications to be an apostle? (Mark 3:14; Acts 1:21-22,26; 1 Corinthians 9:1, 12:28, 15:7-9; Ephesians 2:20, 4:11; Hebrews 2:3-4; 2 Peter 1:16-2:1; 2 Peter 3:2; 1 John 1:1-4; Revelation 21:14) The recognized danger of false prophets. (2 Corinthians 11:13; Revelation 2:2)

In light of that are there apostles living today?

Were there other biblical periods where miracles were tied to new revelation from God? (Exodus 4:3-9; 1 Kings 17:24, 18:36-39; John 2:11, 14:10-11; Acts 2:22)

Is there any indication in the Bible that sign gifts may be temporary? (1 Corinthians 13:8-10; 1 Timothy 5:23)

Are there theological errors and biblical abuses related to current signs and wonders movements? (1 Corinthians 14)

Was the gift of tongues a known human language on the day of Pentecost? (Acts 2:3-12)

Is it probably that “the tongues of men and of angels” is hyperbole for great oratory skills? (1 Corinthians 13:1 cf.; Acts 12:21-22)

If the Holy Spirit makes intercession with “groanings which cannot be uttered” is it likely that that is silent to us but heard only by God? (Romans 8:26-27)

Is there any evidence in the Bible that the gift of tongues was considered a private prayer language?

What biblical direction was given for the purpose and exercise of the gift of tongues in the New Testament? (1 Corinthians 14)
